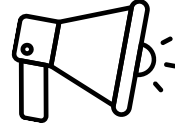

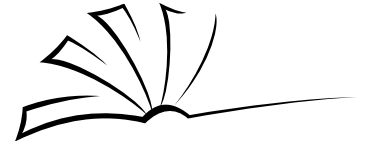

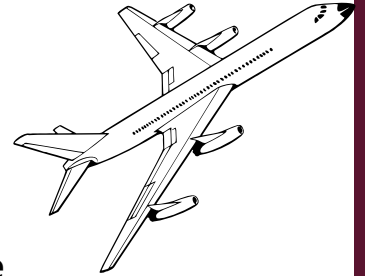

AIRCRAFT ENGINEERING

What is Aeronautical Engineer?

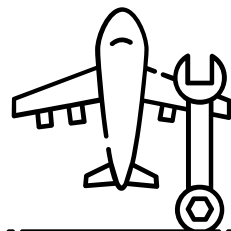
Aeronautical engineer is the professional title given to the person who inspects, maintains and repairs all flight devices, and develops new flight designs so that an aircraft can travel smoothly.



What Does an Aeronautical Engineer Do?

The aeronautical engineer takes on many responsibilities, both on land and in the air. The professional obligations of the aircraft engineer can be grouped under the following headings;

- 1) To design the aircraft planned to be produced, to prepare a project,
- 2) Supervising aircraft systems including engines and other critical flight devices.
- 3) Diagnosing and correcting problems that may arise,
- 4) Making flight controls,
- 5) Adjusting engine power when the pilot requests a certain power setting during takeoff and landing,
- 6) Inspecting the external equipment of the aircraft before travel,
- 7) Reviewing the flight path and weather conditions to determine how much fuel should be loaded onto the aircraft.
- 8) Recording fuel consumption during flight and reporting engine performance,
- 9) Supervising fuel, pressurization, air conditioning, hydraulic, electrical, ice and rain protection, fire and overheat protection settings,
- 10) To ensure that the center of gravity remains within the limits,
- 11) Troubleshoot emergency landings and abnormal technical conditions
- 12) Calculating takeoff and landing data,
- 13) Reading the checklists and performing the necessary duties as per the captain's orders, for aircraft engineers in the automotive and white goods sectors.



Technology Centers and Air Supply Maintenance Centers are the leading public institutions and private companies operating in aviation and space. 7.7% of aircraft engineers find a job before they graduate. The rate of those who find a job in the first 6 months after graduation is 49.9% Aircraft engineering, which is the profession of young people in love with the sky, "The rules in aviation are written in blood." and Atatürk's "The future is in the skies." with letters expressed its importance.

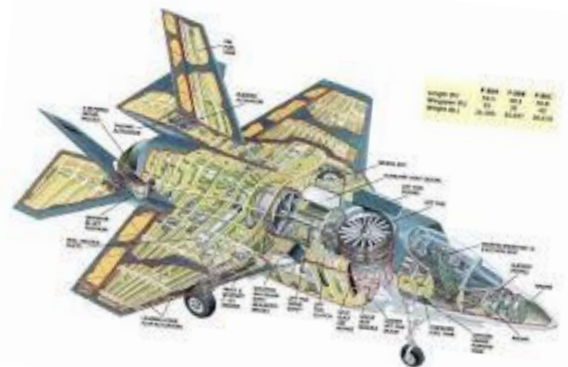
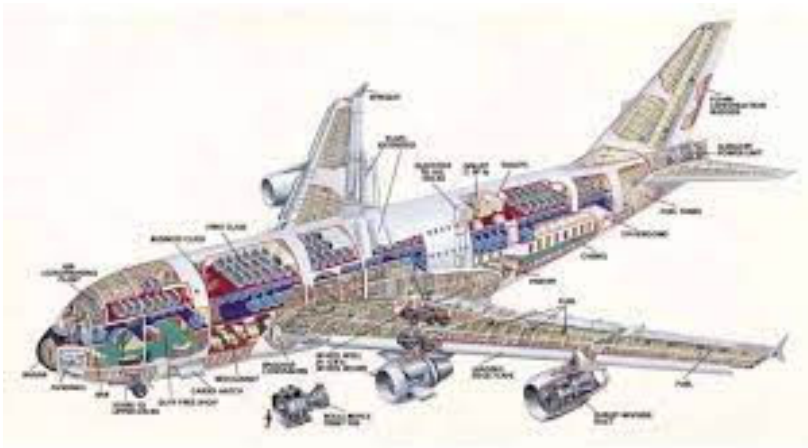

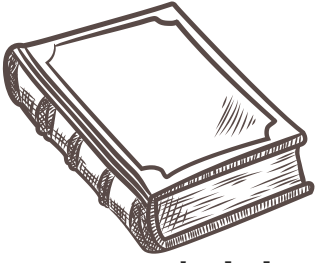


THE ART OF TILE

Tile art is a traditional Turkish handcraft. The history of tile art dates back to the Karakhanids. It is formed by shaping the soil after cooking and producing goods. Tile art was continued by the Great Seljuks and Anatolian Seljuks. During the Seljuk period, many mosques, medresa, palaces, tombs and caravanserais were decorated with tile art. With the establishment of the Ottoman state, the art of tiles experienced a different period and gained meaning. Tile art, encountered on the walls of tombs and mosques from the Ottoman Empire, also adorns the interior and exterior facades of palaces and mansions. The tiles of the Dome of the Rock, built by Abdulhamid II and located in Jerusalem today, are among the most well-known examples of tiles.

This profession, which has been going on for years, still manages to attract people's attention. Now let's get to the details. First of all, seven different materials found in nature, such as quartz, kaolin, chalk and sand, need to be ground and turned into mud. This dough is slowly shaped on the rotating wheel and these processes take about twenty days. After that comes the painting, beautiful patterns are drawn on the frit and painted in fresh new colors. In this art, mostly firuze so mean turquoise color is used. Finally it comes the glazing. It can also be called a kind of polishing. Before firing, glaze is spread and after the material comes out of the oven, it looks as if there is a shiny hard structure on it. And as a result, the art of tile making comes out with its beautiful colors.

*Abdurrahman Cahit Zarifođlu

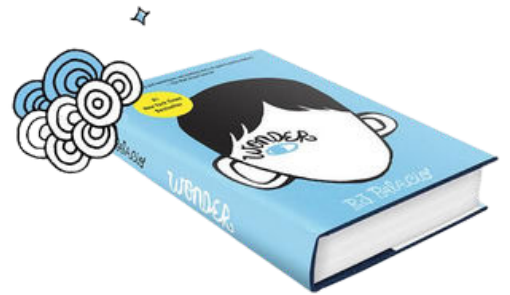
Zarifođlu was born on June 1, 1940. He studied at Istanbul University Faculty of Letters, Department of German Language and Literature and completed the university in 10 years due to his workload. His friendships with Rasim Özdenören, Alaeddin Özdenören, Erdem Beyazit and Akif İnan, which started in Kara high school, continued in the magazines "Diriliş", "Literature" and "Mavera". The poet, who taught German in Istanbul, travelled to Europe by hitchhiking in his travels in Germany. Then he started to work TRT1 as a translator. He married with lady Berat in the same year. Necip Fazıl was the witness for the wedding. Zarifođlu, who won the Turkish Writers' Association Children's Literature award with Yürekdede and the Sultan, passed away on June 7, 1987, due to pancreatic cancer.

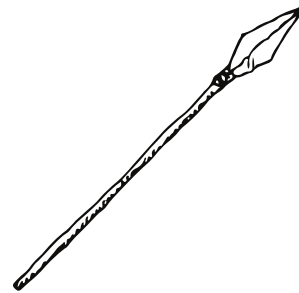
*Western Civilization in the Middle Ages

The Middle Ages is known as the “Dark Age” in western Europe. The concept of the dark age was first introduced in the 15th Century. It began to be used by Italian intellectuals in the XVIII century. The Dark Age, although it is not known for certain, is the period starting with the migration of tribes and ending with the conquest of Istanbul (ad. 500-1500).



After the collapse of the Roman Empire, there was a huge decline in the intellectual accumulation of Western Europe with the classical sciences. With the pressure of the Church, science, philosophy and free thought disappeared in the West. Scientific treatises were written and read haphazardly with uncluttered translations from Greek. Greek Arabic and science translations were carried out during this period.

Philosophy, science, education, etc. in the Islamic World, which came from the east in the following periods, was assimilated, developed, and also reproduced with original values. The encounter of the Medieval West with the fields led to an intellectual leap in the west, paved the way for the emergence of new currents of ideas and the opening of universities. It is possible to say that this phenomenon accelerated the Renaissance in the west.

*CAT STEVENS

Rising of A Revolutionist

Steven Demetre Georgiou aka Cat Stevens is a British singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist. His musical style consists of folk, pop and rock.

His Family;

His father was Cypriot and his mother was Swedish but he was born on 21st July 1948 in UK. His parents divorced when he was about eight years old, but continued to maintain the family restaurant and live above it.

Exploring Music ;

Georgiou developed an interest in piano at a young age. At 15, inspired by the popularity of the Beatles, he became interested in the guitar. And he made his first hit song "I Love My Dog" when he was 18. By releasing the album "Matthew and Son" in 1966, he was named Cat Stevens. This album reached top ten in the UK charts.



Tuberculosis;

Unfortunately, in 1968 when he was nineteen, Stevens contracted tuberculosis. During this time, Stevens began to question aspects of his life and spirituality. He later said, "To go from the show business environment and find you are in hospital, getting injections day in and day out, and people around you are dying, it certainly changes your perspective. I got down to thinking about myself. It seemed almost as if I had my eyes shut."

Mona Bone Jakon;

After his illness, he released his most popular album "Mona Bone Jakon" in 1970. The first single released from Mona Bone Jakon was "Lady D'Arbanville", which Stevens wrote about his young American girlfriend Patti D'Arbanville. It reached number 8 in the UK and sold over 1 million copies, was awarded a gold record in 1971.

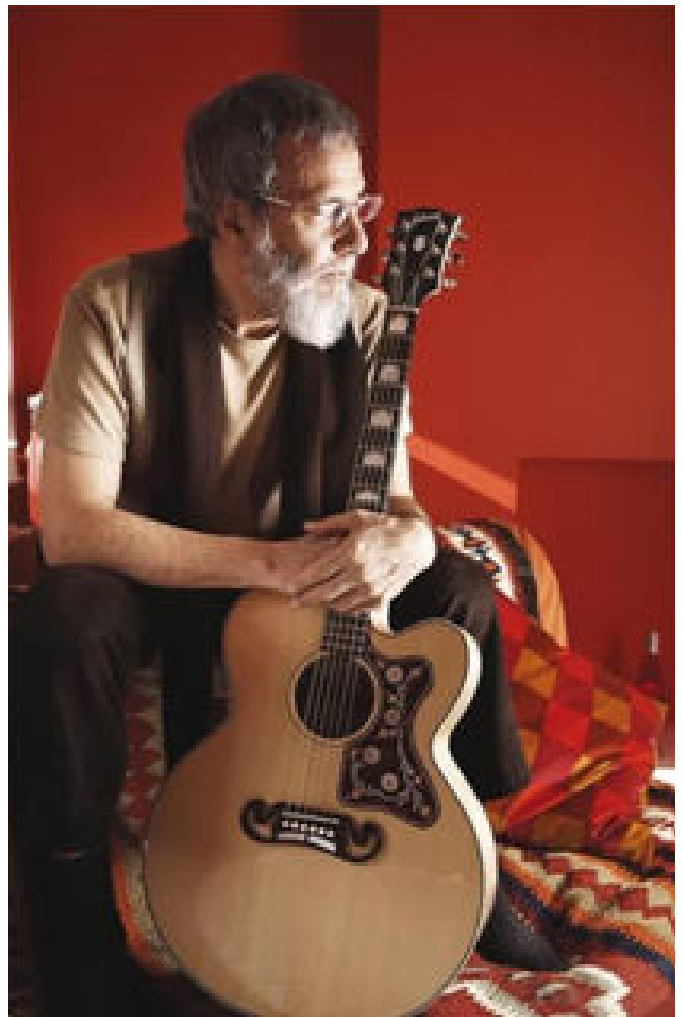
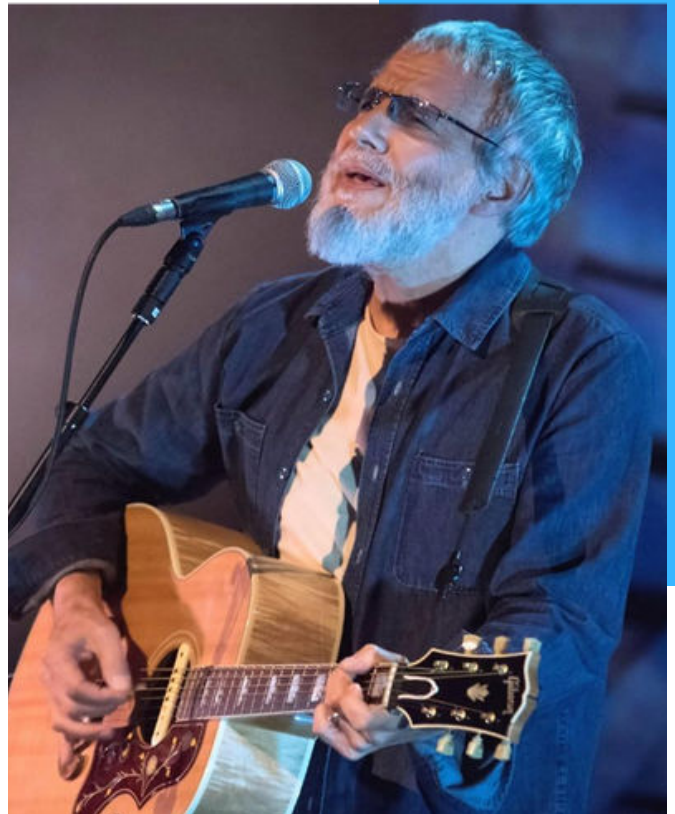


Religious conversion (Muslim)

While on holiday in Marrakesh, Morocco, Stevens was intrigued* by the sound of the adhān, the Islamic ritual call to prayer, which was explained to him as "music for God". Stevens said, "I thought, music for God? I'd never heard that before - I'd heard of music for money, music for fame, music for personal power, but music for God!"

In 1976, Stevens nearly drowned off the coast of Malibu, California, and said he shouted: "Oh, God! If you save me I will work for you." He stated that, immediately afterwards, a wave appeared and carried him back to shore. This brush with death intensified* his long-held quest for spiritual truth. Stevens' brother David Gordon, a convert to Judaism, brought him a copy of the Qur'an as a birthday gift from a trip to Jerusalem.

Stevens said on BBC, "I would never have picked up the Qur'an myself as a free spirit; I was more aligned to my father's Greek Orthodox beliefs." After studying the Quran, Stevens formally converted to the Muslim faith on 23 December 1977, taking the name Yusuf Islam in 1978. Yusuf is the Arabic rendition* of the name Joseph; he stated that he "always loved the name Joseph" and was particularly drawn to the story of Joseph in the Qur'an.

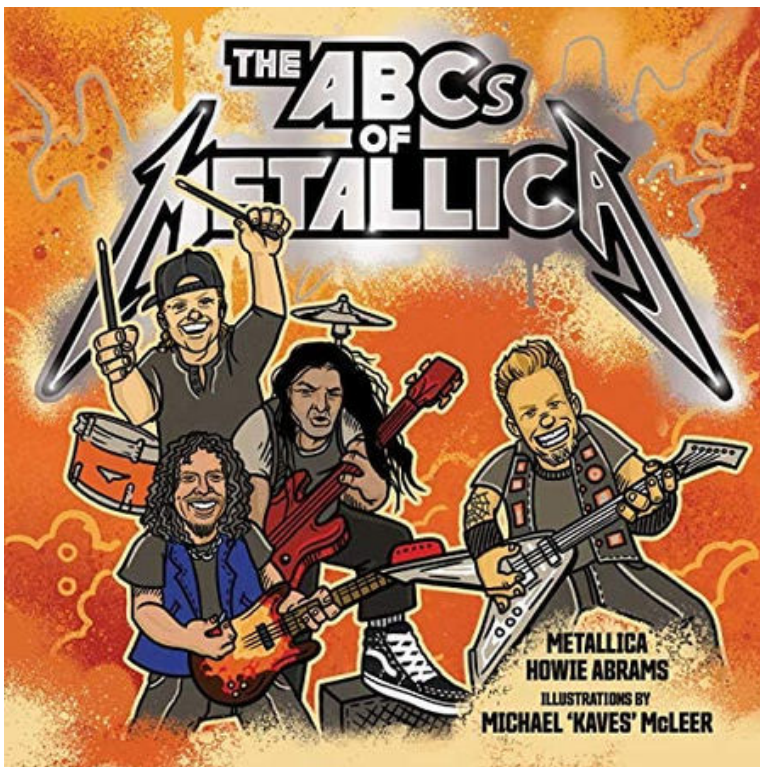

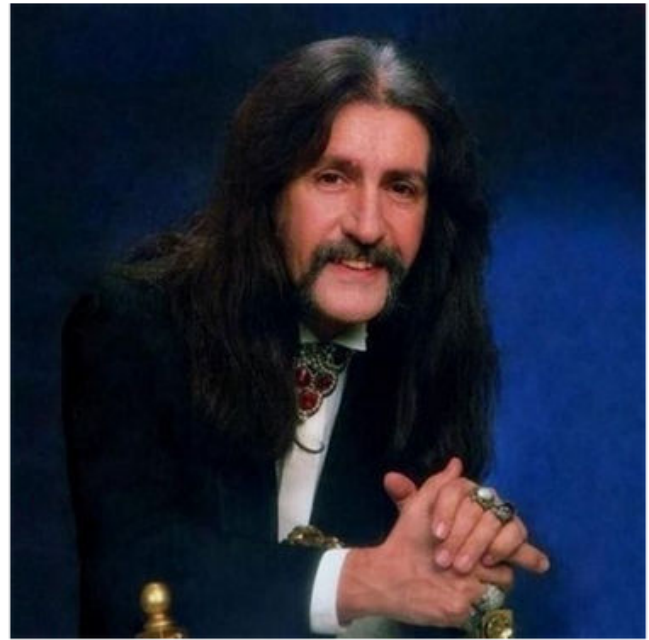

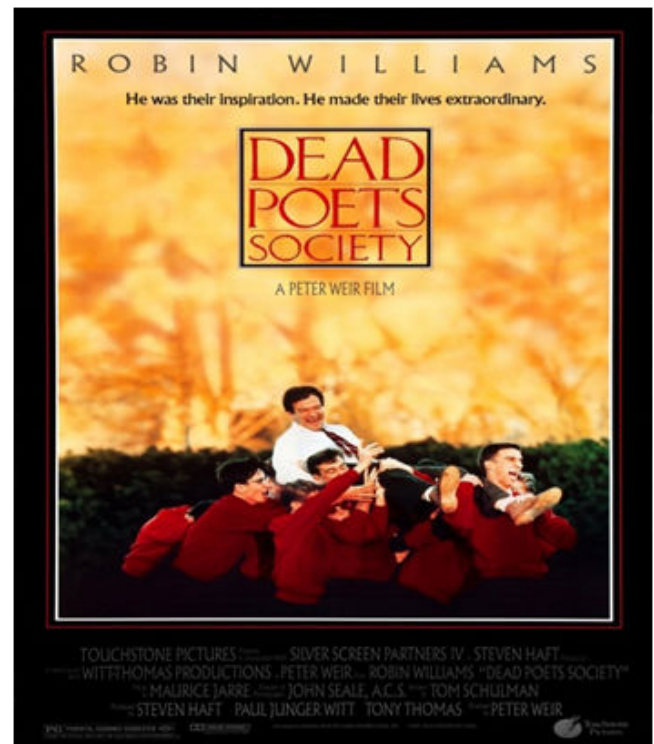
Movie of the Month

It isn't frequented very often by travellers on holiday, so you rarely have to worry about crowds in the area. Despite this, you'll find a few exciting things to do, including walking through the outdoor pathways by the seaside, where you'll find painted tiles and a crumbling church dedicated to San Gennaro. Praiano's many local restaurants offer exquisite seafood and authentic Italian dishes.

“A Drink to Die For”



Limoncello is an Italian lemon liqueur mainly produced in Southern Italy, especially in the region around the coast of Amalfi. In northern Italy, the liqueur is often referred to instead as limoncino.

Delizia al limone, “the lemon delight”, the dessert that is a symbol of Sorrento, celebrating the 43rd anniversary of its creation this year. To make the perfect dessert, the lemons of Sorrento are necessary and their zest must be grated with glass, so that the oils contained in it may release their unmistakable aroma into the cream.
