SCIENCE NEWS

A bold plan to save the planet turns carbon dioxide into stone.



Workers drill into the ground in Wadi Lawayni, a remote valley in Oman.

Millions of years ago, unusual rocks were pushed to surface here through a rare geologic upheaval. Now in contact with the air, they are reacting with carbon dioxide, locking the greenhouse gas into solid minerals.



At these alkaline springs in Oman, water emerges from the ground saturated with dissolved calcium.

The calcium quickly reacts with CO2 in the air, forming films of calcium carbonate (calcite) that can appear within 24 hours

. The water leaves a frosty coating of calcite crystals as it flows over the rock. Over long periods of time, the mineral builds up into beautiful stairstep terraces, called travertine.

Robots made of cells blur the line between creature and machine.

Bio bots built from living tissue could be used in both medicine and pollution cleanup.



The scientists call their creations
"computer designed organisms."
Outside of the lab, though,
the devices are known as xenobots (ZEE-noh-bahtz).

Engineers in Illinois have designed a "biohybrid" robot, illustrated here.

Cells called motor neurons (green) trigger muscle tissue (red) to contract, closing the robot's pinchers and allowing it to swim.

These bots can move on their own and heal themselves after small injuries.

They can also complete tasks, like working together to push objects from one place to another.


Xenobots mimic living things in some ways. Now, they can even replicate. The larger blob (right) is one of these computer-designed organisms. The small round blob (left) is its offspring — a clump of stem cells that can grow into a new organism.

Researchers have rejuvenated a 53-year-old woman's skin cells so they are the equivalent of a 23-year-old's.

The scientists in Cambridge believe that they can do the same thing with other tissues in the body.

The technology is built on the techniques used to create Dolly the cloned sheep more than 25 years ago.

The head of the team, Prof Wolf Reik, of the Babraham Institute in Cambridge, told BBC News that he hoped that the technique could eventually be used to keep people healthier for longer as they grow older.



Robots trained to act more 'likeable' to humans

Scientists have been exploring the kind of personalities robots should have to make humans more comfortable around them.



Experiments into artificial intelligence and robotics by the University of Hertfordshire, using miniature models of Star Wars droid BB-8, showed people reacted best to machines that appeared to be curious and playful.

Dr Marcus Scheunemann said:
"People might be just more likeable towards this kind of robot, more receptive and more happy that it is around them."

It could be many decades before every home has a robotic assistant but this is among the first research of its kind in preparation for that time.

They used materials such as porcelain, granite and Teflon instead of copper, especially in the production of kitchen utensils. This led to the decline of coppersmithing. There are very few copper masters in our country today.

How to make a copper pan?

First, a copper plate of appropriate dimensions is taken. Then this plate is cut into the shape of the item to be made. The copper plate is shaped by hitting it with a hammer.


Copper is engraved with a tool called a nail-like "pen".

*Stefhan Zweig

Stefan zweig is a journalistic writer who lived from 1881 to 1943. He lived the pinnacle of his life between 1920 and 1930. His favorite work, chess, has taken him to good places.1. He volunteered for the army during World War II and worked as a civil servant in the war archive in Vienna. After that, he returned to his home country of Austria. Meanwhile, the country's last emperor was a first-time emperor. Karl was exiled to Switzerland and described his experiences with his kings at the border in his book Die Welt von Gestern. He then moved to Salzburg in 1920, where he married a mother of two. In 1933, because he was originally Jewish, just as they did with other writers, the Nazis burned all his works and exiled him. After exile, Stefan zweig settled in Brazil and committed suicide a year later in 1942 with his second wife.

HISTORY

The Battle of Badr

The Battle of Badr was the first battle fought for the religion of Islam.

This war is a war fought in the month of Ramadan. The Muslims, whose goods were confiscated before the Hijra, organized an expedition to the trade caravan under the command of Abu Sufyan in order to get their goods again. The Muslims dominated the wells of Badr and gained superiority over the polytheists. And they won the war.

*On the 17th of Ramadan, the Muslims and the Quraysh army moved towards Badr
*The Muslims reached the Badr wells before the Quraysh and these wells were closed.

*The Messenger of Allah (pbuh), He sent Umar as an envoy and offered the Quraysh to return to Mecca without a war, but the Quraysh insisted on fighting.

*The war began after the one-on-one confrontations called mubareze and ended with the victory of the Muslims in the afternoon.

*70 polytheists, especially Abu Jahl, who was the greatest enemy of Islam and our Prophet (saas), were killed and 70 people were taken prisoner. On the other hand, Muslims gave only 14 martyrs.

*It is mentioned in the Qur'an that Muslims were supported in this war with the help of angels:

//"Allah had helped you at Badr, when you were a contemptible little force. So be mindful of Allah, perhaps you will be grateful."// Surah Al-i İmran-123

//" 'Remember' when you cried out to your Lord for help, He answered, "I will reinforce you with a

thousand angels—followed by many others."// Surah Al-Anfal-9





Laylat-al-Qadr is otherwise known as the Night of Power and is considered to be the Islamic calendar's Holiest eve.
During this night, Angel Jibril revealed the Holy Qur'an's first verses to the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). This night
falls within Ramadan's final 10 days, and although the exact date is unidentified, it is commonly thought of as the Holy
month's 27th day.



EID-AL-FITR

So, what is Eid? Eid translates to "the festival of breaking the fast", marking it as a celebration of the ending of the monthlong fast of Ramadan. This festival is a particularly significant time for Muslims in the Turkey and across the globe alike, enabling families to join together and partake in the celebration. After a month of abstinence and devotion to Allah (SWT), the festival allows Muslims to reward themselves with what they previously gave up in the name of their faith.

Ways to Celebrate Eid

Ahead of the festivities taking place, many rituals need to be followed so that Allah (SWT) is properly thanked.

These preparations include wearing the finest clothes and visiting the Mosque. The traditional Eid greeting is "Eid Mubarak", which translates to "blessed festival/feast"; however, this can also bear similarity to "happy Eid" or "blessed celebration". After greetings have been shared, Eid prayers can commence.

With this being said, before Eid prayers can begin, a charity donation needs to be made. This is called Zakat ul-Fitr, or Fitrana, which is given to the needy, allowing them to partake in festivities.

Another tradition includes the exchanging of gifts amongst close family members and children, whilst sweet snacks are also made available. As a result, this can be described as the "Sweet Eid".




How to learn a language by yourself?



This cold soup is similar to gazpacho in that it is a cold tomato-based soup. The difference is that water is not added and they use bread to thicken it up, so it's a much heartier version. Usually, it is served topped with a chopped hard-boiled egg, ham and tuna fish on top. The soup gets its name from the town of Antequera, another city in the province of Malaga, and an interesting place to visit if you are looking to take a day trip from Malaga while you are here.

ESKISEHIR



Eskisehir province, a city of origin, was known in Ancient and Medieval Times as Dorylaion in Greek and Dorylaeum in Latin. In Arab sources, the city was named Darauliya, Adruliya and Drusilya. Our province is a very old settlement center. The first settlement point of the region is Dorylaion, 6 km north of where it is now. Eskisehir is also called because its history is very old. It became a province in Eskisehir in 1923.



Eskisehir is 200 miles (four hours) from Istanbul, 146 miles (three hours) from Ankara and 310 miles (six hours) from Izmir. There is also one terminal and airport in Eskisehir. Trams and buses provide local transport.







Things to Eat Eskisehir

Eskisehir is famous for its food as well as its attractions. First of all, the chives, which is information that not everyone knows about, came from this region. Local dishes called Abısta are a type of cheese that can replace bread and have been brought to their culture by circassians. The Acı gıcı dish is a dish that resembles the same leaf wrap, but is wrapped only in Acı gıcı grass. Rabbit stew, another regional dish, is the most consumed local dish by tourists.







a) Porsuk river:

This river, which runs through the heart of the city, has an important place in the city. Cafés, restaurants and cultural sites can be found around. You can go for a gondola ride in this river or sit on the edge and read a book.





b) Woodpaper houses:

Woodpaper houses, which are a historical building in Eskisehir, are located to the east of the center. These ottoman houses are usually two storeys and the majority have been well maintained to date.



c) City park:

A city park, a place where people can have a good time and cool off. You can take a dip in the water on this place's private beach or take your fishing rod and go fishing.





d) Midas monument (written rock):




